- Hobbies: being artistic, going to concerts, chilling at the beach, and doing chemistry research

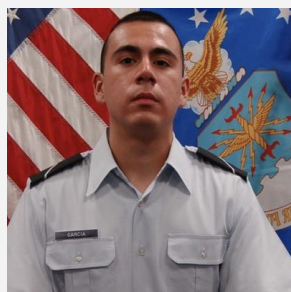
200 C/Wikoff
